❖ **Congratulation to the new partnership between the Rev. Ann Camber and Gathering Table**

Rev. Ann began her ministry at Gathering Table on September 15, 2022 as incumbent. She was the Deacon Associate at St. Paul's and was leading services at St. Thomas on two Sundays a month.

Rev. Ann will be ordained to the priesthood on October 15 at 2 pm at Gathering Table, one week before this Deanery Council Meeting. On behalf of Archbishop Anne, I send greetings and blessings to Gathering Table and their new incumbent. I am completing this report 4 days before her priestly ordination and I am excited!

Parish Vacancies

3 parishes are vacant: St. Michael and All Angels, St. John's Schreiber and St. Mary's Nipigon. Please continue to pray that God will call the right people to serve in these parishes.

I am grateful for the loving commitment and dedication of our current incumbents Canon Ed, Rev. Jonathan, Rev. Ann, and Captain Deborah, and for the desire to serve of our parochial lay readers, diocesan lay readers and retired clergy. Thank you and bless you!

❖ **Archbishop Anne's Dinner**

The dinner was held at the Knights of Columbus on Friday, June 17 and I thank Bonnie Shipston for all of her work in organizing the dinner. It was wonderful to have Archbishop Anne in attendance and hear her diocesan updates and motivational words of wisdom and support.

❖ **Update on use of grant money to upgrade church security**

Several parishes in our Deanery received funding through the Ontario Grant to Support Anti Hate Security Measures for Faith-Based and Cultural Organizations. The Grant was even opened up for a second year, and Gathering Table applied and received additional funding to add anti-hate security measures.

Here is how individual parishes have used their grant money

St. Paul's

St. Paul's received \$7,500 and used the funds to upgrade their door locking systems. They have also switched from Thunder Bay Telephone to APEX for the installation and subsequent monitoring of the alarms.

St. Michael's

St. Michael's received \$7,500 and they have installed new exterior lighting and are getting quotes on security cameras.

Gathering Table

Gathering Table has received two grants, each for \$7,500. With their \$15,000, Gathering Table is spending the grant money on lighting and on protective coverings for some of the windows.

St. John's Schreiber

St. John's received \$5,000 and purchased protective coverings for their stained glass windows and are in the process of purchasing and installing several security lights (solar) around the outside of the church and the thrift shop.

St. George's

Out of their \$5,000 grant, St. George's has purchased outdoor lights and is considering adding lexan to the stained glass windows.

❖ How are we doing with implementing the 7 approved resolutions that arose from the Response to the Archbishop's Charge Committee at 2021 Synod?

Resolution 1

That our parishes celebrate a day of lament and gratitude on Friday March 11th, 2022, the 2nd anniversary of the Declaration of the Pandemic by the Canadian House of Bishops, in remembrance of those who lost their lives during the pandemic.

Resolution 2

That we are committed to the common good and to loving our neighbour, and we urge everyone, who is eligible or able, to be vaccinated against COVID-19.

ONGOING. I received my 5th vaccination in September 2022.

Resolution 3

That the synod delegates for 2023 bring cards from their congregations that identify the

community-building ideas that were tried and worked, and the ideas that were tried and didn't work between Synod 2021 and Synod 2023. The cards, similar to the seeds presented at Synod 2017, will be presented during the Opening Worship at St. Luke's Cathedral.

Resolution 4

That we honour the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation every September 30 through worshipping together as a diocese, deanery or congregation either on September 30 or on the Sunday closest to September 30.

A POTENTIAL DEANERY PROJECT. There might be future interest in having a service on September 30 at the Spirit Garden (by the Marina). I encourage members of Deanery Council to determine if there is interest by indigenous people to take the lead on this service.

SUPPORT FOR INDIGENOUS BURSARIES THROUGH THE MINI-CAMINO 'SAY YES TO KIDS' ANGLICAN FOUNDATION. Over \$8,000 was raised and some of the money was given to the Diocese and to the Anglican Foundation. St. Paul's received a cheque for \$5000 which will be

allocated to graduates from Dennis Franklin Cromerty High School who are currently attending college or university full-time.



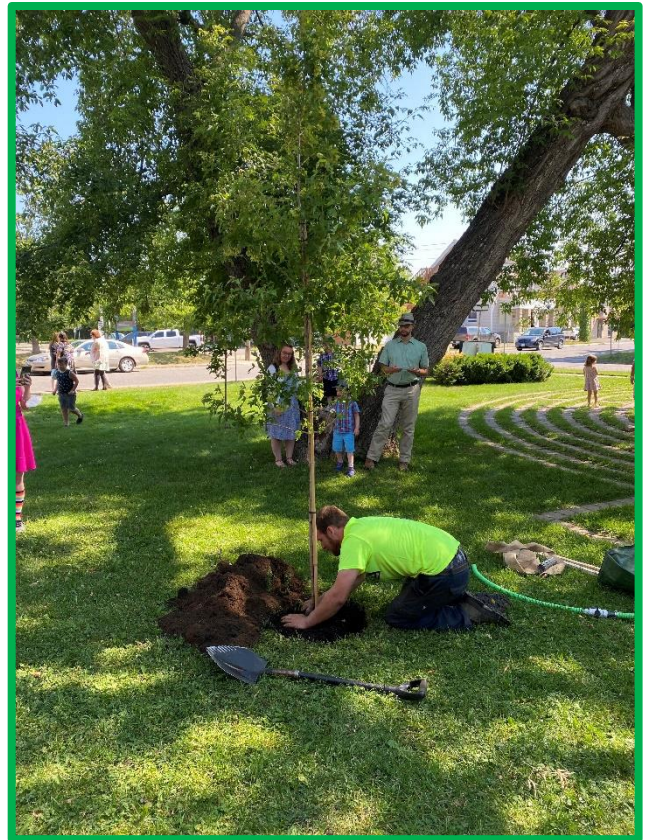

We are slowly returning to the level of activity that we had prior to COVID. This season the Port has been shipping more potash due to the war in Ukraine, which is a major potash exporter. Ships loading potash are normally alongside 24 hours, so there is less opportunity for seafarers to go ashore. Due to the poor grain harvest in 2021, there have been fewer ships loading grain. Hopefully this will change as the 2022 harvest comes into the Port. Cruise ships came into the port this summer and we assisted with taking crew to Walmart. One weekend, we provided transportation to take crew to the Lakehead University gym so they could play basketball. Shore leave is not being granted regularly.

I took vacation this summer. When I am away, experienced volunteers assume the role of Person-in-charge, and they keep the Centre running so that seafarers are assisted. Thank you to David Stephens and Irene Wyrozub for taking this role on.

We are working at resuming our community building events. After a hiatus of nearly 3 years we are dusting the cobwebs off. These events are important as we need a community to support our mission and ministry. I would like to thank the Thunder Bay parishes for their support.

We are looking for volunteers, particularly drivers. We have just enough and a few more people would be great. We are also looking for a treasurer.

Blessing of the Fleet

It went well considering not done in 3 years, and that we had a late start in organizing it. 100% rain was forecasted for the Blessing of the Fleet, but it did not rain on Saturday morning. It was good from the point of view of refreshing everyone's memory of what to do. 5 vessels participated: Cape Challion, OPP, 3 sailboats. 35 spectators were on land, not including the pipe band.

Open House

We held our annual Open House on September 25. About 22 visitors attended and several expressed interest in volunteering.

MTSC Conference

Pastor Matthew Diegel and I are attending the conference in Vancouver the week of October 17. The Senior Chaplain and Board Chairs from the stations in Canada will be in attendance as well as staff from the International Headquarters from the UK. We will have an opportunity to share experiences and concerns and learn what is done in other stations. As well, we will receive briefings on various issues of concern.

I am on the Board of Directors for MTSC and am the secretary.

PWRDF TBNS Deanery Report Sept 2022 to Deanery Executive and Deanery Council Oct 22

Since the last report of April/May a number of PWRDF initiatives have been highlighted throughout the deanery. This has been done by means of contact with parish representatives who then publicize them in their parishes and through information I send to the Deanery Net Web.

The Deanery Net Web continues to post contact information for donations to the Vaccine Equity Fund.

As new partnerships develop with agencies offering support to Ukrainian refugees that information has been summarized and disseminated through the Deanery Net Web.

A number of new PWRDF projects were highlighted over the summer and early fall.

Parishes were encouraged to support the Indigenous Ministry Fund through the sale of orange marigold seeds or plants. This idea came forward from the last Deanery Council meeting

Over the summer information was sent out about the new "Wild Ride" project and parishes were encouraged to develop individualized "athons". One fun project, St Paul's 8 hour puzzle-athon, was written up in the PWRDF newsletter. Some parishes are in the planning stage of holding an "athon" this fall.

Primate Linda Nicholls will be contributing her musical abilities to her annual hymn sing for PWRDF on Sept 22 and Sept 24. This has been well supported in the past and some parishes have indicated that this will be a fall focus for them.

Our smallest congregation of St John's Schreiber out did themselves by raising 1,000 dollars for PWRDF from the sale of homemade donuts. St Paul's is in the process of holding a cutest pet contest with funds raised from a 5 dollar entry fee going to buy goats for health workers in Malawi to supplement their small salaries. There has been excellent participation from outside the parish for this. Our deanery parishes really do support each other.

When the Wild Ride athon project ends in mid-October I would like the deanery to focus on the Mishamikoweesh Water Project. Our deanery has a longstanding relationship with Bishop Lydia Mamakwa and this would be so helpful to her community. I have sent information on this to the parish reps for their consideration and I would like time to speak about this at the Deanery Council meeting in October.

Deanery of Thunder Bay – North Shore Anglican Church Women's Report to Deanery Council October 22, 2022

Our 54th Annual Conference of the Diocese of Algoma ACW was held on Wednesday, June 1, 2022 via Zoom. Delegates began to join at 9:15 am. Jacquie Howell, our Treasurer and Zoom Host and I as Diocesan President, welcomed 48 attendees, a total that varied during the course of the day. Our National ACW President, Margaret Warwick, was able to join us from Surrey, B.C. where she was vacationing and brought greetings from the National Board. As we are all learning, the use of Zoom technology allows us to have guests join us from anywhere they are able to access internet.

The Most Reverend Archbishop Anne Germond, Diocese of Algoma ACW Patron, led us in a lovely Service of Morning Prayer with Readings for Ascension. Music was provided by Ruth Cassie of Muskoka. In her reflection, Archbishop Anne talked about transformation and new creation. Our lives have been changed and transformed by Jesus' ascension. Ascension reminds us that all we do is through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The test of our successes is not what we have done, our thoughtfulness or friendliness but how the gifts of the Holy Spirit flow through each of us and how the fruits of the Holy Spirit are evident in and through us. We were reminded that the work of the Holy Spirit never comes to an end.

The In Memoriam lists for each Deanery, honouring the women who passed away in 2021 were read by the Presidents/Coordinators or a representative. The ACW candle was lit and remained until the Conference ended.

Anglican Foundation Executive Director Scott Brubacher joined us to update us on the work of the Anglican Foundation. The plan for the 2022 campaign of Say Yes! To Kids is to raise \$200,000 through partnership fundraising from April to June. From the applications for projects last year 6 in Algoma received \$27,000. Of the 84 proposals received, there were 79 applicants accepted in 2021 for a total of \$470,000 in projects. The ACW Board pays the Annual Membership in the Anglican Foundation. Everyone is encouraged to support membership and to make applications for grants for ministry or infrastructure.

The following are the members of the ACW Diocesan Board: President - Janet Pike; Our Patron - Archbishop Anne Germond; Chaplain - Reverend Catherine Murkin; Vice-President- Emily Noble; Secretary - Gina Newhall who was unable to join us; Treasurer - Jacquie Howell; Past President - Darla McMeeken; Devotions Chair - Sue Goodwin; Family Life Chair - Joy Stott; Communication/PR Chair - Sharon Corston who was unable to join us; Social Action Chair - May Seguin; Deanery Presidents and Coordinators – Donna Komhyr - Algoma; Linda Smith – Muskoka who was not in attendance; Sherry Steeves-Beaudoin - Sudbury-Manitoulin; Lynda Hughes and Pam Handley -Temiskaming; and Ruth Merkley - Thunder Bay – North Shore.

Our choices for our Thank Offering Mission for 2022-2023 were: the Hospital for Sick Children whose plan is to build a new facility by 2025 and Covenant House, Toronto which is a non-profit youth social service agency providing food, shelter and crisis care 24/7. Covenant House was voted as the choice for 2022-23.

We have been invited by the Deanery of Temiskaming to gather Tuesday to Thursday, May 30, 31 and June 1, 2023 in North Bay for our 55th Annual Diocesan ACW Conference. We will discuss the possibility of setting up a hybrid of in-person and Zoom for our gathering.

We had a very good day. There were opportunities for sharing of ideas and discussing what has been going on in our parishes. Three groups met together at their churches to take part in Zoom and were able to have fellowship at lunch. There was a great deal of pleasant chatter and catching up during the lunch break as the Zoom connection remained open. There were lots of smiles, hellos and chuckles. I

hope that everyone feels inspired to try new ideas. As Archbishop Anne said, "We are living in a new normal, but in the power of the Holy Spirit."

St. Michael and All Angels' ACW group remains the only active branch in our Deanery. Meetings are the first Tuesday of the month at 1:30 pm. The ladies have a Christmas Bake Sale Saturday, December 3 from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm in the Church Hall. Coffee and tea will be served. This group is committed to supporting missions. Meetings begin with a Devotion, followed by the business session and concluding with a time of fellowship. All Anglican women are welcome.

The Deanery ACW Executive will be meeting soon to plan a Deanery meeting. More information will be coming.
