
The webinar will include a fuller description of the research findings from the program, as well as other aspects of the program offerings, including future directions.

Join EAPO and CNPEA for our upcoming Webinar: Disclosure and Reporting of Abuse Against Older Adults on September 25th

This webinar sheds light on why older adults do not seek help in cases of abuse through demonstrating three levels of barriers: individual, interpersonal, and systemic that impede on disclosures.

Based on research interviews with older adults with lived experience of abuse and service providers working directly with older adults in Alberta, the presenters will provide a case study and highlight the key themes that emerged from their study:

- Barriers to disclosure and reporting of abuse;
- Facilitators to disclosure and reporting; and
- Key tensions between service providers' and older adults' perceptions of the disclosure and reporting process.

They will also provide recommendations and action steps to increase awareness, promote disclosure, and improve services for older adults experiencing abuse.






Deanery Day Afternoon will be Saturday, October 19th from 1–4:30 pm at St. Thomas Church.

Organ Concert with Dr. Isabelle Demers Sunday, November 3, 2024 3:00 p.m.

First United Methodist Church ("The Coppertop Church on the Skyline") 230 East Skyline Parkway, Duluth, MN

Internationally-renowned concert organist **Dr. Isabelle Demers** will perform a Rededication Concert on Sunday, November 3 at 3:00 p.m. at First United Methodist Church in Duluth, MN. This concert celebrates the completion of the church's recent renovation and expansion of its Austin pipe organ.

Demers' playing is described as having "bracing virtuosity' (Chicago Classical Review) and being "fearless and extraordinary" (Amarillo-Globe News). She has enraptured critics, presenters, and audience members around the globe, appearing in recital throughout Europe, Oman, Australia, New Zealand, the United States, and Canada. She is in continual high demand by her colleagues, as witnessed by her performances for numerous regional and national conventions of the American Guild of Organists, the Institute of Organ Builders and International Society of Organbuilders, the Royal Canadian College of Organists, and the Organ Historical Society. She has released multiple CD recordings.

A native of Québec and a doctoral graduate of the Julliard School, Dr. Demers is an Associate Professor of Organ at McGill University in Montréal, Québec. She was formerly the Joyce Bowden Chair in Organ and Head of the Organ Program at Baylor University in Waco, Texas.

Ms. Demers' concert will include works by J.S. Bach, César Franck, Bedřich Smetana, Charles-Valentin Alkan, and Rachel Laurin. A free-will donation will be accepted. Reception to follow.

Photo submission criteria:


- Photos should be wide instead of tall. Vertically-oriented photos are less likely to be chosen as they do not often work with the horizontal orientation of the calendar.
- File size should be at least 1MB in size (one megabyte). (For the experts out there: images of 3500px wide or larger, 4:3 orientation are preferred. If you don't know what this means, don't worry about it! Just submit what you have.)
- Permission to submit the photo must be secured from anyone identifiable in the photo itself (or for minors in the photo(s), parent/guardian permission is required).

Additional tips:

- Photos showcasing church building exteriors are popular among the calendar audience; photos which focus on people tend to be less popular.
- Consider submitting photos from multiple seasons of the year. Offering a variety
 of images increase the potential of one being selected.
- Let us know if your church or parish is celebrating an anniversary for the calendar year—it has made a difference in the selection process at times!
