

Moustapha N. is currently living in Morocco after fleeing his home country of Senegal where he was seen as an outcast because he's a member of the LGBTQ+ community. He is 32-years old. He was working on a Phd prior to being a refugee. We expect Moustapha will arrive in Canada within the next 3 months. It could be much sooner, depending on travel arrangements.

We have to raise about \$5,000 to have enough money to support this refugee for one year.

### An Invitation to an Advent Ecok Study With Assisting Bishop Michael Culton



As we approach the sacred season of Advent, a time marked by anticipation, reflection, and hope, I am writing to invite you and the members of our diocese to join Bishop Michael Oulton, our Assisting Bishop, in a special Advent Book Study.

This year, we will be engaging with a thought-provoking book 'Jesus and the Powers: Christian Political Witness in an Age of Totalitarian Terror and Dysfunctional Democracies' eBook: Wright, N. T., Bird, Michael F.: Amazon.ca. With the Canada Post strike underway you might consider purchasing the ebook.

This Advent study will be held on the Zoom platform and run for three consecutive Wednesday evenings in Advent - December 4th, 11th, and 18th from 7pm to 9pm.

The study will focus on how Advent—the season of the church year that focuses on the first and second comings of Christ—can inform and shape our understanding of political engagement and discipleship in today's world. Through the lens of Jesus' life, ministry, and the powers that sought to oppose him, we will explore the intersection of faith, politics, and justice. may register for this study by emailing Carla MacEwan at <a href="mailto:Carla.macewan@dioceseofalgoma.com">Carla.macewan@dioceseofalgoma.com</a>. The Zoom link will be sent out on December 1st and it will be the same link for all three evenings.

Advent is a season of waiting, longing, and preparing for the coming of Christ. It calls us to reflect on the promise of God's kingdom breaking into the world, even in the midst of political turbulence and societal unrest. N.T. Wright's book offers a timely exploration of how the message of Jesus intersects with the political powers of our time, encouraging us to consider the Christian witness in an age where faith and politics are often seen as separate realms.

Bishop Wright and Professor Bird note that the objective of their book is to "say that in an age of ascending autocracies, in a time of fear and fragmentation, amid carnage and crisis, Jesus is King, and Jesus' kingdom remains the object of the Churches' witness and work. That is true today, tomorrow, the next day, until death and despots are no more, until such a time when he has put all enemies under his feet. Such a conviction means that the Church needs to understand how it relates to empires biblical and burgeoning, how to build for the kingdom in our cities and suburbs; to understand the time for obedience to the State and the time for disobedience to the State." The season of Advent, when we remember the king who was promised and the king for whom we wait, is an ideal time to consider our responsibility as kingdom citizens living in the meantime.

Bishop Michael would be honored if you and your clergy or parishioners would consider joining us for this enriching study. Whether you are seeking deeper theological insight into the relationship between faith and politics or simply looking to reflect on the meaning of Advent in our contemporary context, this study will provide ample opportunity for discussion and spiritual growth.

We look forward to the possibility of walking through this season of Advent together, as we anticipate the coming of Christ, reflect on the world we live in, and renew our commitment to living out the hope, peace, joy, and love that Advent represents.
